Notice on COVID-19 vaccination

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About reserving the vaccine

An appointment is required to receive the vaccine. Please refer to “How to get the vaccine” on the reverse side for more about how to make an appointment.

When you make your appointment, you will need to set up two sessions. Please also confirm the day you will receive the second vaccination. *For the Pfizer vaccine, it would be three weeks later. For the Moderna vaccine, it would be four weeks later.

About the Pre-vaccination Screening Questionnaires for COVID-19 vaccine

There are two COVID-19 vaccination vouchers: one for the first vaccine (yellow border) and one for the second vaccine (light blue border).

Please make sure to bring the correct one at the time of your vaccination.

Things to bring:

Vaccination Certificate

This will act as proof of vaccination.
Please keep this close at hand after
your vaccination.

First session (yellow form)

Pre-vaccination Screening Questionnaires

Please fill out the pre-vaccination
screening questionnaire beforehand.

Second session (light blue form)

outlined in red is your vaccination voucher.
The 10-digit number in the “Ticket number”
field (券番号) is your vaccination number.

- ◆ Identity verification documents
such as health insurance card
- ◆ Medication record (for those
who have one)

We have changed the border color and
the writing on the reverse side of the pre-
vaccination screening questionnaires and
vaccination vouchers to make the difference
between the first and second session forms
clearer.

We cannot reissue another vaccination voucher onsite. Please do not forget to bring it to the vaccination venue.

About the vaccines used for the first and second doses

For either the Pfizer or Takeda/Moderna vaccines:

*As a rule, please make sure to receive the same type of vaccine as your first dose at the time of your second dose.

For men in their teens and 20's

Even if you have already been vaccinated with the Takeda/Moderna vaccine as your first dose, you can request to receive the Pfizer vaccine.

Consenting to the vaccine

Upon confirmation at the time of your vaccination that you understand both the risks of side effects and the effects of protecting against infection, we will ask for your consent to administer the vaccine. If we do not receive your consent, we will not administer the vaccine. No one should be discriminated against for not receiving the vaccine nor be forced to receive the vaccine by their workplace or those around them.

For legal guardians of children between the ages of 12 and 15

We will only administer the vaccine if we have both the consent of the child and the legal guardian. If this is the case, **please have the legal guardian sign their name in the signature field of the pre-vaccination screening questionnaire.**

Generally, the accompaniment of a legal guardian is required to receive the vaccine. However, if the medical institution (vaccination site) allows for the child to come unaccompanied and the legal guardian's consent is confirmed by their name in the signature field of the pre-vaccination screening questionnaire, then the accompaniment of a legal guardian is not required for those middle-school age and above.

If the child will not be accompanied, please fill out the "Phone number" field of the pre-vaccination screening questionnaire with an emergency contact (the phone number of a legal guardian that can be reached at the time of the child's pre-vaccination screening and vaccination).

About Underlying Conditions

Those who have underlying medical conditions, please consult your primary care physician first. For more about underlying medical conditions, please refer to the Asahikawa City Homepage.

Relief System for Injury to Health with Vaccination

There have been cases of damage to health (such as falling ill or acquiring a disability) as a result of vaccination. While such cases are extremely rare, a relief system has been set up for those who sustain permanent health damages. For more about the steps necessary to apply, please consult the Asahikawa Public Health Center's Measures for Novel Coronavirus Infection Control Division.

Other items of importance

○For those who wish to receive the vaccine outside of Asahikawa (Vaccination outside of registered city)

If you have a certificate of residence registered with Asahikawa but you are living in a different municipality, by notifying them, you may be able to receive the vaccine in the area where you actually live. Please visit your municipality's town/city hall for more information.

○For those who have moved out of Asahikawa

If you have moved out, you cannot use Asahikawa's vaccination voucher. Please go to the city/town hall of the municipality you have moved to in order to be issued another voucher. You are also required to bring the previously issued one from Asahikawa, so please do not dispose of it.
